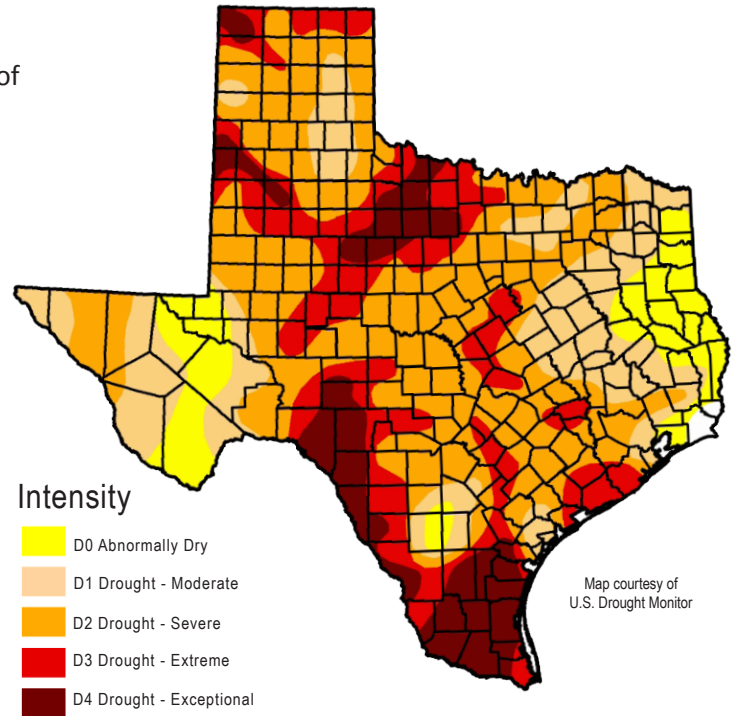


CURRENT DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Minor expansion of the drought from 98.6 to 99.6 percent of the state with a slight reduction in drought severity due to recent rains. Statewide conservation storage is up 100,000 acre-feet from last week, but we're still at the lowest levels since 1990 for this time of year at 66.5 percent full.

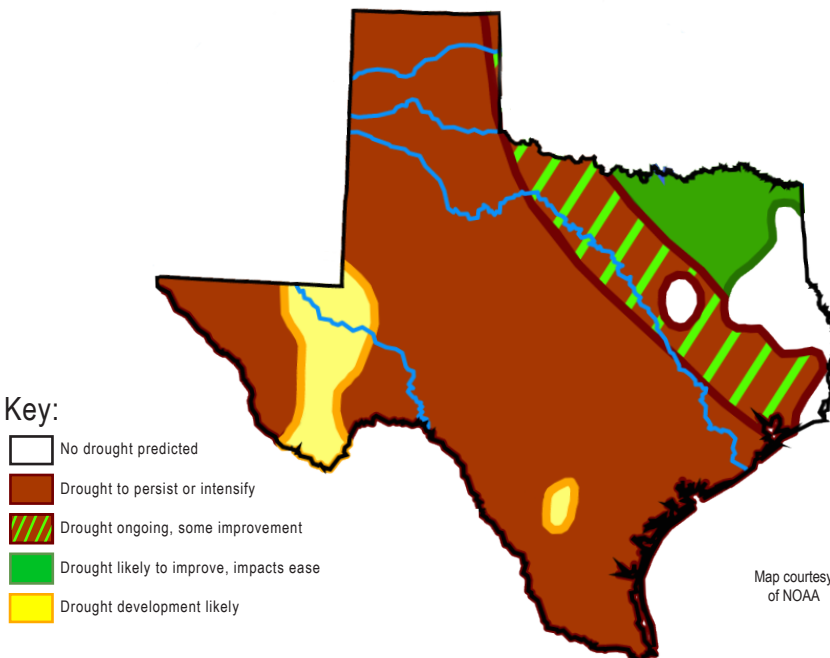
Current drought statistics

- 99% of state currently in drought
- 98% a week ago
- 96% three months ago
- 83% a year ago



SEASONAL DROUGHT OUTLOOK 4/4/13–6/30/13

The most recent drought outlook shows continuing or developing drought for most of the state but also shows improving conditions for the northeastern part of the state.



RESERVOIR CONDITIONS (%FULL)

Statewide reservoir statistics

- Currently 66% full
- 66% a week ago
- 67% three months ago
- 78% a year ago
- Normally 85% at this time

Key reservoir levels

- Amistad (Lower Rio Grande Valley area): 43%
- Choke Canyon (Corpus Christi area): 42%
- Elephant Butte (El Paso area): 11%
- Lavon (Dallas area): 65%
- Livingston (Houston area): 100%
- Meredith (Amarillo-Lubbock area): 0%
- O.H. Ivie (San Angelo-Midland-Odessa area): 20%
- Travis (Austin area): 38%
