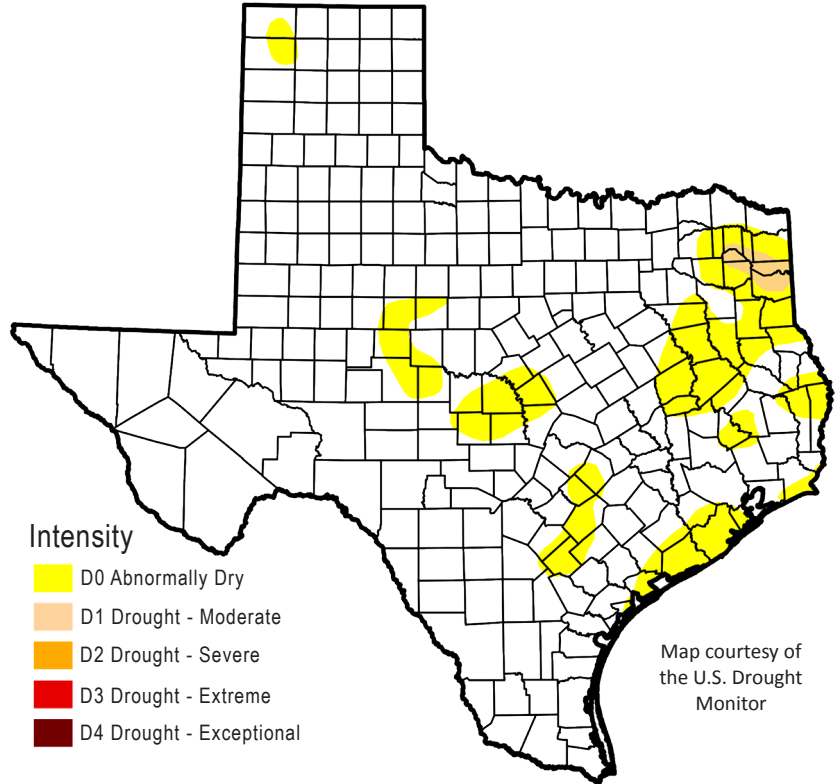


WATER CONDITIONS

It's baaaaaack! After two blissful weeks of no drought in Texas (per the U.S. Drought Monitor), moderate drought has reared its light orange head in northeast Texas. The good news is that reservoirs in that area are all topped off due to ample spring rains. For August, expect drier than normal conditions for the Gulf Coast area of the state.

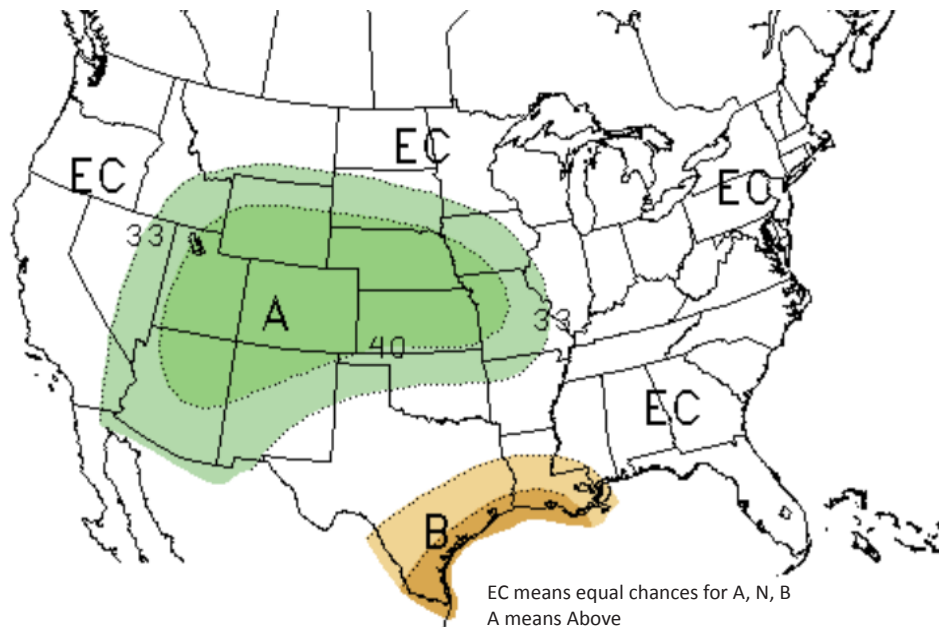
Drought conditions

- 0.65% now
- 0% a week ago
- 31% three months ago
- 58% a year ago



PRECIPITATION PROBABILITY

Projections for August suggest drier than normal conditions along the Gulf Coast and wetter than normal conditions for parts of the Panhandle.
