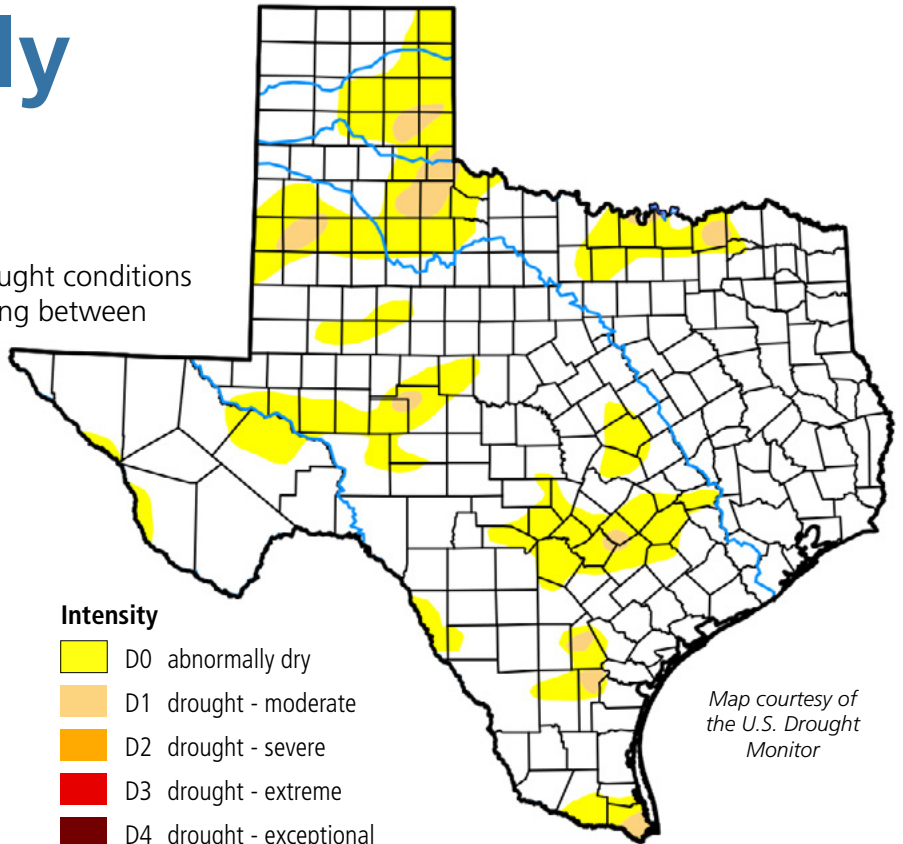

Water conditions

Last week brought us a reintroduction of drought conditions in West Texas with drouthy splotches appearing between Shamrock and Clarendon, between Childress and Matador, west of Lubbock, and west of San Angelo. North Texas, however, saw some improvement. The hot and dry season is nearly upon us, so it will be interesting to see what summer brings us.

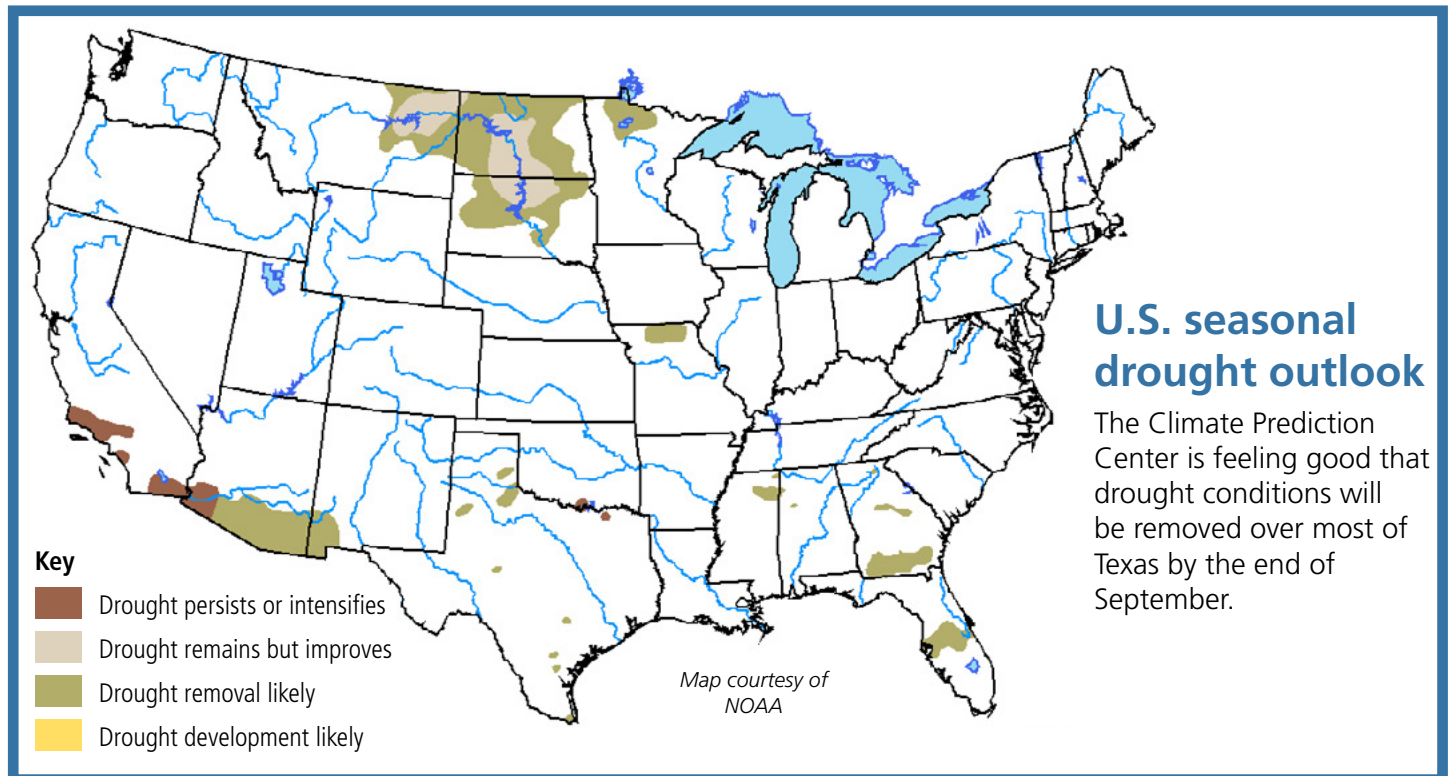


Drought conditions

- ◆ 2% now
- ◆ 1% a week ago
- ◆ 5% three months ago
- ◆ 0% a year ago

Intensity

- ◆ D0 abnormally dry
- ◆ D1 drought - moderate
- ◆ D2 drought - severe
- ◆ D3 drought - extreme
- ◆ D4 drought - exceptional
