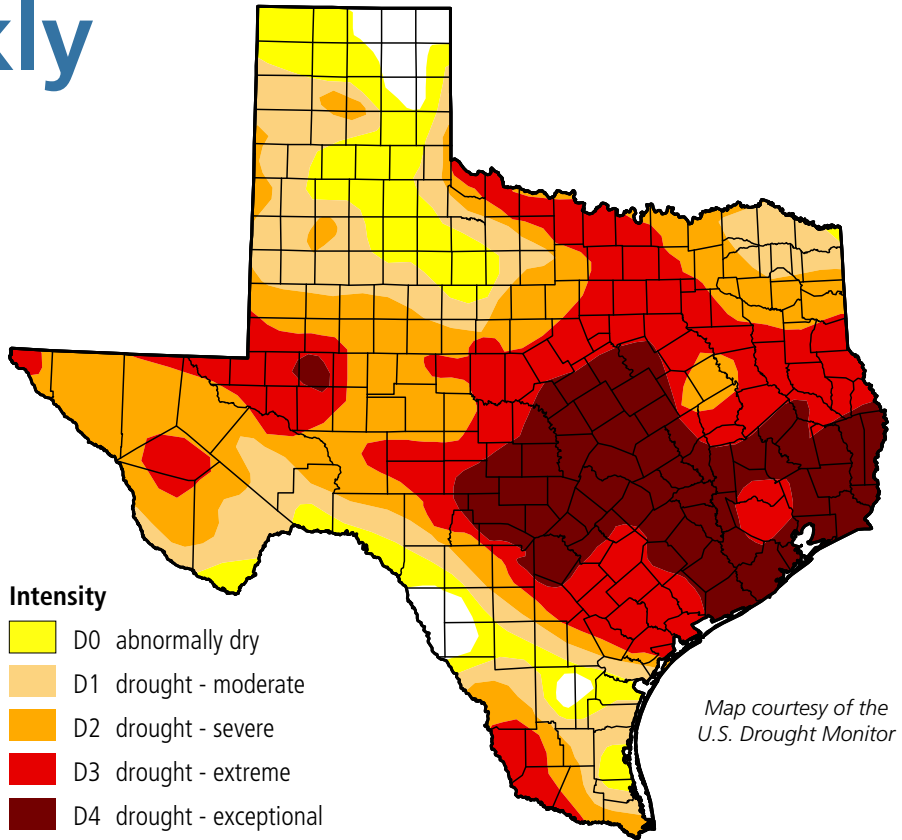

Water conditions

The drought map for conditions as of September 12 shows that the area of the state impacted by drought has not increased, which is only the second week since mid-June that has occurred. Additional rainfall will be required in the coming weeks to shrink drought area.

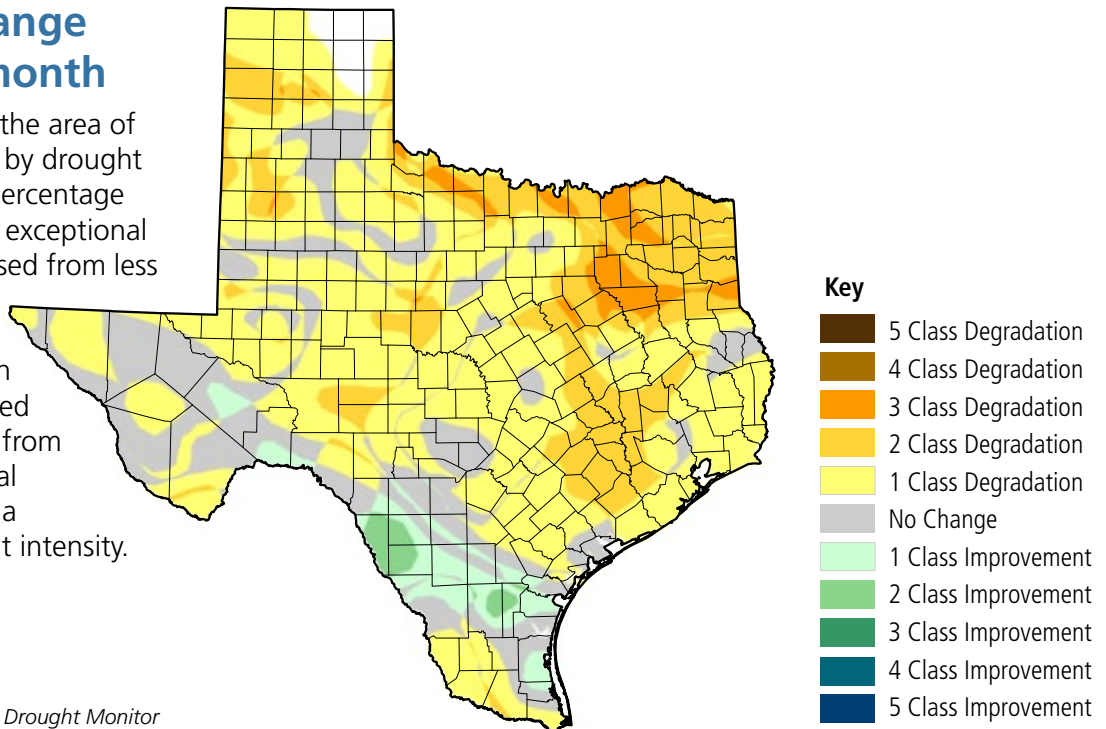


Drought conditions

- ◆ 86% now
- ◆ 86% a week ago
- ◆ 23% three months ago
- ◆ 59% a year ago

Drought change in the last month

Since mid-August, the area of the state impacted by drought has expanded 14 percentage points. The area of exceptional drought has increased from less than 2 percent to more than 18 percent. Only South Texas, which received some precipitation from remnants of Tropical Storm Harold, saw a decrease in drought intensity.
