

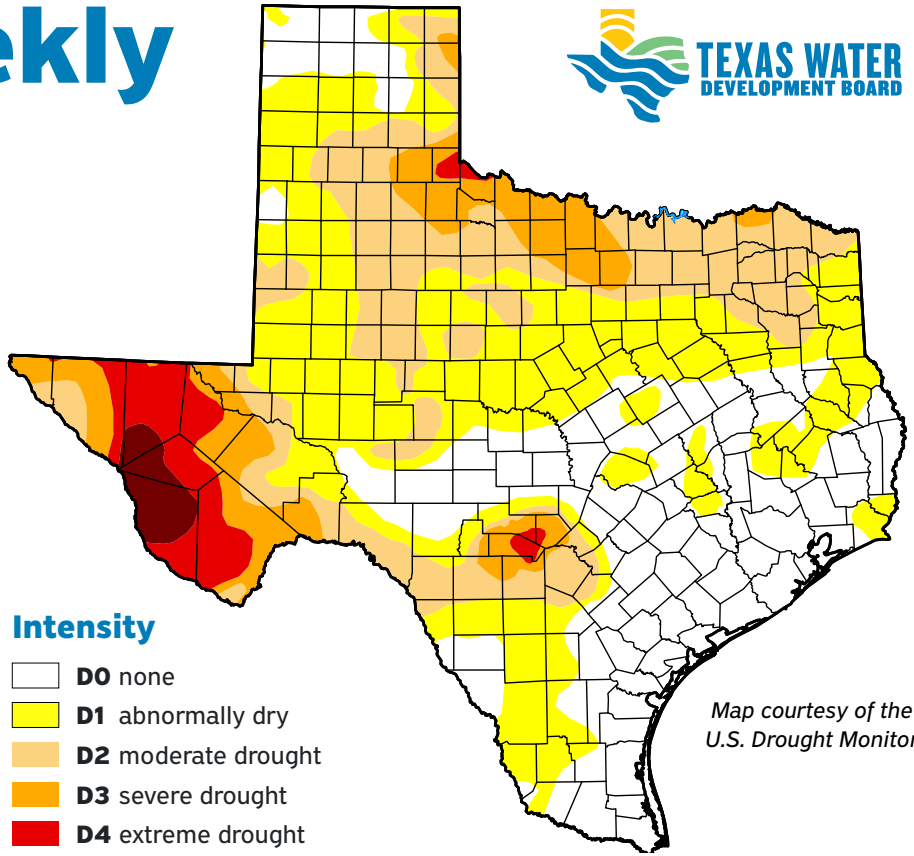

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of September 3 shows a decrease in drought area from the previous week, which is the first weekly decrease in the last five weeks. Widespread rains in early September brought improvements to large areas of Central and West Texas.

Drought conditions

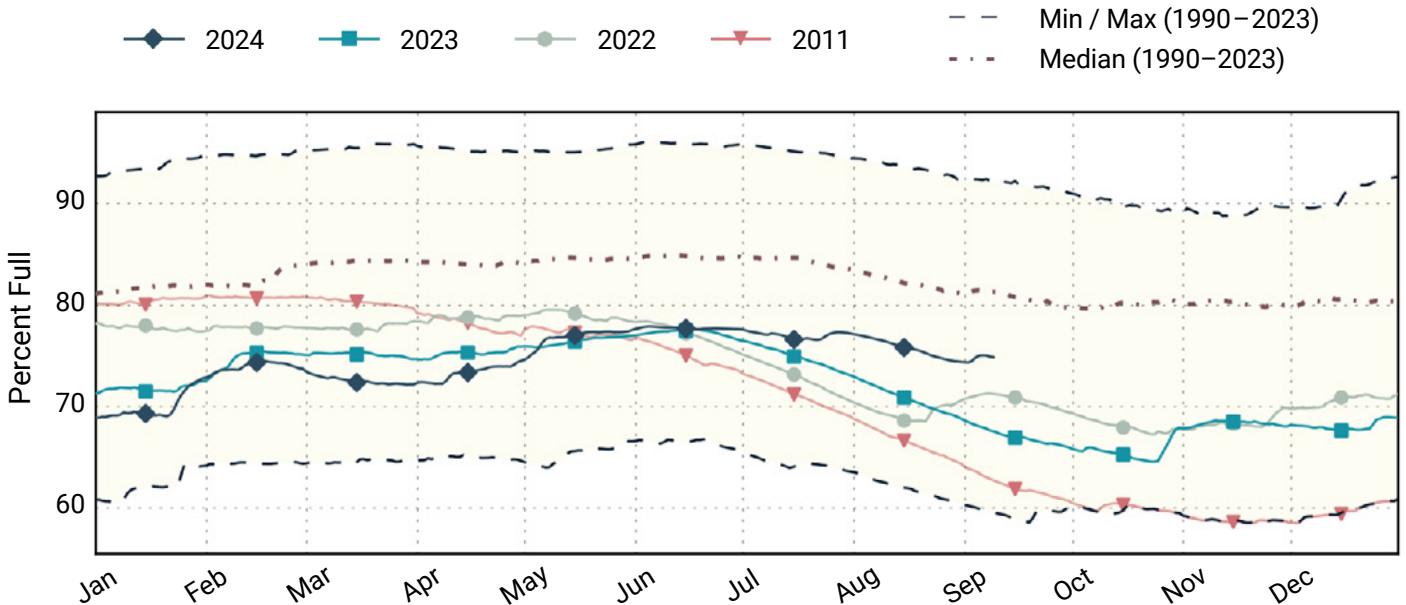
- 36%** now

Statewide reservoir storage

After dropping almost three percentage points in August, statewide surface water supply volume is up almost half a percentage point in September. Current supplies are seven percentage points more than last year but still almost seven percentage points less than normal for this time of year.
